#### Church Board Highlights April 15, 2019

Pastor Dave highlighted the new JOY group beginning in May. Invitations for that are being mailed soon. He also reported that pastoral coverage has been secured for the Sundays when he is away.

James presented vacation days which were approved from August 16-25, 2019.

The property committee continues to work to fix a problem with the dusk to dawn light at the back of the parking lot. They have purchased a new light to be installed. Larry and Mike have inspected the church exterior and there are some windows to be painted and some windowsills for repair. In addition, Jeff Zimmerman has been contacted about fixing some caps on the east tower of the church.

Pastor Dave explained that our previously planned June trip dates were unknowingly double-booked by the organization in Maine. After talking with the group it was decided to change the date to July and still go to Maine. James will be working to change the vans around for the trip.

Pastor Dave reported that the youth have completed 25 Easter baskets for the Children's Home of Reading. Jim Holcombe will be delivering them.

Stewardship Sunday was April 7 and thank you letters have been sent out to all those who have completed Estimate of Giving Cards. Upon reviewing the cards, it looks as though there is a pledged 10 percent increase in giving. It was reported that expenses were \$1,164 for the catering and food, \$357 for Dennis Ritter's services and approximately \$250 in postage, among some other incidental costs. All those who helped put Consecration Sunday together were thanked for their time and work.

The previously approved quote for 2020 offering envelopes was actually quoted for the wrong style of envelopes. James received a new quote which was presented as \$1,053.34. This was presented for new approval which was granted.

Eric Weyandt asked about where we should be looking to install the swing set that was donated last year. There was some discussion about placement and it was suggested to have it as a youth project to help install it. It will be looked into as far as scheduling a work date to do this. It was reminded that the major concerns of the insurance company are that there be a base of soft material and that the frame be securely anchored to the ground.


