

The season of Lent begins 40 days (excluding Sundays) before Easter. Easter is not celebrated on a fixed date like other holidays. A simplified explanation is: Easter falls on the first Sunday after the Full Moon date, based on mathematical calculations, that falls on or after March 21. If the Full Moon is on a Sunday, Easter is celebrated on the following Sunday. (How is Easter Determined? article - WaveBrowser) This calculation corresponds to the Jewish celebration of Passover as indicated in the Scriptures and with the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. Many sources can be found to learn more about this.

But my question is – what do we do with the sacredness of Ash Wednesday as well as the romantic aspects of Valentine's Day? Do we begin to solemnly reflect on Jesus' journey to the cross as we examine our lives and seek God's forgiveness for our sins? Or do we joyfully celebrate romantic love? Or both?

Well - God has provided both. Both are part of our journey on this earth. Sometimes we don't have a "romantic valentine" but we are able to celebrate the love we have for others, children. grandchildren, nieces and nephews, our church family, friends... or, perhaps, someone who doesn't feel loved.

So how will we celebrate February 14 this year? May we honor the day with love, love for our Lord who first loved us so much that He went to the cross for us. AND let us deeply love the people He has given us to love.

#### **Church Board Highlights**

Bernice Hartman was present on behalf of the Blue Mountain Heritage Chorus to request to have their Christmas Concert at Belleman's once again in 2024. The Blue Mountain Heritage Chorus expressed their gratitude to Belleman's for hosting their concert and presented a check in the amount of \$100 for 2023. The 2024 date is December 1 and the concert time is once again 2 p.m. This was approved.

December meeting minutes, Treasurer Report, Pastor Report and Administrator Report were all approved.

Larry Henne reported that the Fellowship Hall roof has been completed as of the date of this meeting.

James Fitterling reported that plans are set for the mission trip February 4-10. Plans are to work with the Fuller Center in Kentucky, but there is a chance they will have a new site in Tennessee which they might be moving us to. It is still about the same distance of travel. There will be 4-5 people attending this trip.

The Community Outreach Committee has plans to have a hoedown event in April, the 100<sup>th</sup> church anniversary on June 8, a movie night in August and possibly an evening old church service in the fall. In order to fund the committee events, it was suggested that the group help out and taking on the Easter candy project. Easter Candy profits for 2024 were approved for the Community Outreach Committee.

James reviewed the cost estimate from SolveIT for the wiring needs for the networking upgrades for the church. Total quoted price for this is \$11,807.00 to include wiring and all of the previously quoted hardware. The question was about where the money would come from and after some brainstorming/discussion since the last meeting it was suggested to use some of the remaining Ray Bauder bequest money. James reported that there is a bit over \$33,000 left from those beguest monies. The Board approved the SolveIT quote for \$11,807 to be paid from the Ray Bauder bequest. This will be included for approval at the congregational meeting on January 28.

James reported that he and John Rausch had a meeting with a local insurance broker to review our current policy and to begin quoting it out from some other insurance companies. Due to the time constraints involved with getting a new policy in place it was discussed about paying for a few months of our current policy and buy some time to review our options. This was discussed with Larry Henne as well.

Louise Elliott was appointed to the vacant 2 year position on the Lutheran Council.

## 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration!

As reported in last newsletter, plans are underway for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of our current church building this June!



After the decision was made to build a new church and the donation of the land acquired, there were many trials and tribulations.

Once the foundation was laid, the next step was the brick-laying. The original bricklayers began the project at 80c per hour, but soon demanded an increase of 25c an hour, which was rejected by the Building Committee, so a new contractor was brought in. That resulted in a cost of \$1.15/hr, with 95c/hr for assistants. It was soon evident that the first contractor had performed sub-par work, and a good portion of the wall had to be taken down and rebuilt. In addition to that issue, Glen Gery Company was unable to provide enough bricks, so bricks were brought in from the Schuylkill Haven Brick company. Many of those bricks were found to be inferior, so they had to be returned.

It was reported that the architects for the building, Hugh and High Architects, seldom showed up for the many meetings needed as the project progressed, which caused much frustration.

Another issue occurred when the fundraisers and personal donations were not enough to cover the ongoing expenses of the build. On August 25, 1922, the Building Committee reported a deficit of \$1,007. A bank loan was made, with the monies due in 10 days which was achieved. Throughout the project, loans had to be made through Leesport, Shoemakersville and Bernville banks.

When the inside arched ceiling of the sanctuary was being constructed, it was discovered that the arches required reinforcement with one-inch tie rod bars across the base of the arch. This was not aesthetically pleasing to the design, and while initially installed, they were later removed. And since the ceiling and arch is still intact, it seems like that extra support was not needed!



Despite all the roadblocks, the church was completed and dedicated on June 8, 1924 at a total cost of \$85,000 which included the inside furnishings. By this date, \$30,000 was still owed in loans, which was paid off by 1939.
