#### Church Board Highlights - February 19, 2024

Treasurer, Larry Henne presented and reviewed his report. He mainly wanted to note that the report shows quite a bit of money and wanted to make everyone aware that it's not all available to spend. The \$7,124 insurance claim check for the old church window repairs along with another \$1,000 donation toward the repairs is in the account. Also, the \$16,788.50 Heffner Fund check which is needed to pay for the church insurance is in the account as well. These extra funds will be in the account until these bills are received.

There was a question about the status of pricing out insurance quote options. James noted that he and John Rausch are planning a meeting with the insurance broker soon to finalize the information that they will need for all of the buildings. In the meantime we continue to pay the current Church Mutual Insurance premiums on a monthly basis until an insurance plan decision is made.

The Property Committee reported that some plaster repairs will be happening in the near future to address some issues in the church basement as well as in the Loft. James reported that there was another pipe that sprung a leak at the Sexton house recently. This one was in the basement and luckily didn't create a huge mess. It was suggested to change over more of the copper pipes to pex as some of the old copper pipes are getting thin in spots. We were quoted about \$1,000 to replace the section of pipes in question. This will be getting completed shortly.

The Mission Team recently completed a trip to Clarksville, Tennessee. The group served with Fuller Center Disaster Rebuilders and they reported that the trip went very well. On the trip they did some painting and drywall repair, flooring installation, hung siding and some other general repairs. There was a suggestion about doing some more projects around the church as well.

It was noted that the motion to approve the Solvelt quote for the wifi upgrades was approved by the Congregation on February 4. Ken Borkey has made contact for them to begin scheduling the work. The next step will be to explore our needs to upgrade our internet to Comcast.

Contributions to both wider church bodies are due soon and were discussed. Total contribution suggested was \$2 per average worshipper and as past practice, we would split that amount in half. Part going to the Association and the other half to the Mission District. The Board approved a \$75 contribution to the Covenant Association and a \$75 contribution to the East Berks Mission District.

March 6 is our date to host the Lent lunch and James noted that we need volunteers to provide the food. He noted that we likely need 3 crockpots of soup, sandwiches, drinks and desserts. We will be the third week so once we see how many folks are attending the early weeks it will be easier to discern how much food is needed.

Since the build for the new church website by Interlace Communications they have graciously fully covered the maintenance fees for the site for the last few years. Those fees will no longer be covered and will convey to us at a greatly reduced rate. Alyse Hein submitted a breakdown of total costs to run and maintain the website at \$508.29 yearly. After discussion, this fee for the website was approved.

Additionally, bills are coming for some plumbing repairs at the sexton house and for some plaster repairs at church.



#### 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the "New Church"

The time is getting closer for the upcoming celebration of our existing church building, which will be held on Sunday, June 8, 2024!

The following are some of the costs involved in building the church, as recorded in the church history book written by Milton K. and Luella E. Blatt:



~Glass work by J. M. Kase & Co., Reading -

\$3,200 plus an additional cost of \$100 for each figure and design. (All glass between the vestibule and the sanctuary, and the sanctuary and Chapel were donated by that company)


- ~Sanctuary roof by Vera Cruz Roofing, using 16"x16" asbestos shingles laid French method - \$860
- ~Chapel roof by Frantz and Luppold, Reading, with Jones-Mansville built-up shingles, complete with spouting and flashing \$270
- ~All sanctuary furniture by Kundtz & Co., Cleveland, Ohio, for a contract price of \$5,060 including pews, screens, reredos, but they broke the contract and charged \$6,400
- ~All door hardware made of brass by Penn Hardware Co., Reading \$411.50
- ~Electric wiring \$302
- ~Steam heat installed by A.P. Merkle of Fleetwood \$3,950
- ~Light fixtures by Richard Vicary of Reading \$629.69
- ~Delco light system, 56 cell, 110 volt \$1,395 (but later the church connected to direct current)
- ~Red tile in the Narthex installed by Landis Tile & Marble Co. \$400
- ~Church bell from McShane Bell Co., Baltimore, MD, is a 1600-lb. 42" diameter, Tone F Bell \$1,255., less 15% delivered and installed with a 15-year warranty.






