April Showers Bring May Flowers

We have all heard the phrase, *April showers bring May flowers*. As I write this article --- it is raining. It rained yesterday; it is expected to rain tomorrow. It almost seems like too much of a good thing. Will this overabundance of rain bring an abundance of May flowers? That remains to be seen. That is the way with much of life; we are unsure of how things will turn out.

God's Word addresses this in various places. As we consider the flowers, Matthew 6 uses the lilies to share that we should not

worry:

²⁵ "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life...²⁸ "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. ²⁹ Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ³⁰ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³⁴ Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Often we do worry; we may have concerns for our health or the health of a family member. We may have financial concerns or have concerns about the crops we have planted. We might worry about world events or struggles within our own country. Worry drains us of the hope and joy God ultimately desires for us. It is true, as Matthew 6:27 also shares,

²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

In reality, stress and worry might shorten our lives by leading to all sorts of medical situations. Does that mean we should not have concern or show compassion to others in the midst of their deep struggles? I don't believe so; but for matters outside of our control, I believe, God wants us to put our trust in Him – and find our comfort in His provision. Remember the words of Jesus not long before He went to the cross, John 14:27:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

Our Lord can be trusted to lead us through both the valleys and the mountaintops. Our Lord is with us. Even as we recently celebrated the Resurrection of the Living Christ, my hope for you is to experience our Lord's presence. While in the midst of rain -- we look forward to and hope for the

Church Board Highlights March 18, 2024

The Minutes from the February meeting, the Pastor Report and the Administrator Report were approved.

Treasurer, Larry Henne presented and reviewed his written report. He noted that the Lutheran investment amount of \$9,292.41 was received and is noted on his report. The amount was moved into the holding account. He also noted that the 2023 audit was completed in February.

The Property Committee is working to tie up some loose ends on some projects. Plastering repairs in the loft were completed in February, fire extinguishers were serviced in early March and Emergency lights at the church are in the process of being replaced.

The Community Outreach Committee has completed the Easter Candy fundraiser and will be meeting after Easter to get plans settled for the Hoedown in May and continue with June anniversary plans.

In regards to the church insurance, information was provided to the insurance broker seeking new insurance quotes and we await a reply on possibilities and quotes.

Diane Rothenberger discussed her report on the February Synod event that she and her husband Rick attended. Her full notes were printed in the meeting packets. She noted that it was a very interesting event and the bishop is very motivated to work on ministry building in the synod. She also introduced the book "Cultural Architecture" which was supplied by the synod to each congregation in attendance. She read it and has it available for anyone else who would wish to read it as well.

Ken Borkey presented a plan by Boy Scout Troop 154 to build an addition onto the scout shed near the parking lot to house the trailer they recently purchased. They have donations to cover costs and plan to do the work themselves. This plan was approved.

James reported that the Easter Dawn service is over at the Mohrsville Church of the Brethren this year. That would usually mean that our pastor would be the preacher for the service. However, the Church of the Brethren has a younger member, Kurtis Rohrbach who has interest in ministry and would like to preach for the Dawn service. Pastor Pat was in agreement on this. Since we don't have a big part in the service this year, we will be offering to have someone from Belleman's do the opening for the service.
